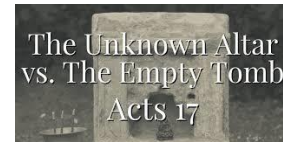

Acts 17 Paul inspired by the Spirit in Athens

²² Paul stood in front of the leadership council and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. ²³ For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.'

What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴ The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵ nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things.

²⁶ From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, ²⁷ so that they would search for God and investigate him in his creation and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us.

²⁸ For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we too are his offspring.'

²⁹ Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals.

³⁰ While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, ³¹ because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed. The assurance that God has chosen this man is this: he has raised him from the dead."

Prayer: Lord help us proclaim with courage to our friends the amazing assurance we have of the resurrection and how this transforms our living every day. Amen

Jesus said to his disciples: ¹⁵ “If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. ¹⁷ This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

¹⁸ “I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you.

¹⁹ In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. ²⁰ On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. ²¹ They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them.”

Prayer: Lord we pray for wisdom to follow your commandments, and we thank you for your unconditional love. We rejoice that you live with us, and we in you. Amen



Short Sermon from Fr Gerry Walsh, priest at English Martyrs Tuffley and St Augustine's Matson

On 75th Anniversary of VE Day Queen Elizabeth II spoke to the nation. She reminded us to never give up to never despair, just like the country did during World War II.

But what really touched me was when she said ‘But our streets are not empty; they are filled with the love and the care that we have for each other.’

Knowing she is a practising Christian I immediately thought of the Holy Spirit which unites the Christian family whether we are separated by denomination or isolation. Jesus says to his disciples in the Gospel ‘I shall ask the Father and he will give you another Advocate or Paraclete to be with you for ever.’

The essential idea behind ‘Paraclete’ is that of someone who stands beside you in time of difficulty, providing a comforting, supportive and encouraging presence. One thinks perhaps of a highly respected person whom you might ask to go to court with you and act as character witness. Such is the idea that the Gospel applies here to the Spirit.

Though Jesus may no longer be physically present, the comfort and assurance his presence gave the disciples during his lifetime will continue in the presence of the Holy Spirit.

In the face of constant trial and rejection from the world, the Paraclete will be for his disciples the 'Spirit of Truth' in the sense of imparting to them a conviction that what they believe and hold on to is indeed reality in the most profound sense.

The Gospel begins and ends with the sense that believers have entered into the same reciprocity of love that unites the Father and the Son.

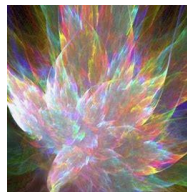
When the community is indeed one, where love prevails, the atmosphere of love that it experiences is nothing other than a sharing in the communion of love that is the Godhead.

Indeed, our streets are not empty they are filled with love.

Loving Jesus, thank you for asking your Father for another 'Paraclete' and together pouring that Spirit of Truth upon us. Thank you for the love that has been filling our streets during the Pandemic.

Spirit of Truth, enable us to have our answer ready for people who ask us the reason for the hope that is within; and help us to be love in our streets. Amen.
