That's why we have set up a virtual prayer room where you can take responsibility for praying for Tuffley during a specified hour of your choice each week.

How should I pray?

As Christians we believe that God hears every word we utter, knows every thought in our minds, every flutter of our hearts, every tear we have cried and the inmost depths of our souls. Our method of prayer doesn't matter — God will turn his attention to us and hear us. It's important to listen to God too. What might he be saying to us? Take time to be still and be aware of his presence.

We recognise that some may not find praying for the whole hour very helpful. That's ok. Please pray at some point during that hour.

There are several links to online resources you can use as a guide to help you pray or you can use what is printed in this booklet.

We suggest you begin by lighting a candle and being still in God's presence.

Prayer Changes Things!

This is a phrase that I think the church family of St Barnabas are getting used to hearing! I believe that prayer is a wonderful gift that each of us has, to get to know a loving God who is passionately interested in us, our families, our community of Tuffley and our world.

Firstly, I believe prayer changes things because prayer changes us. When we pray, we can truly be ourselves, because God calls us as we are. We don't have to use special words or go to a special place although these things can be helpful. We can come to God in prayer, whether we are happy or sad, thankful or hurting or rejoicing or grieving. These are anxious times we find ourselves in and I have spoken to many people who say day to day life, and prayer is a bit of a struggle.

A man called Paul taught some early Christians that they should not fret or worry – instead they should pray -shape those worries into prayers. If you would like to find out more about that teaching find Philippians 4, 6-7 in the Bible. In my life when things have been difficult, I found that if I prayed (and it can be hard sometimes) I felt God close by and a sense of wholeness and calm.

Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:6,7

Secondly I believe prayer changes things because God's Spirit is at work in the world through our prayers. When we pray, we enter special space that opens up to all sorts of possibilities. Jesus tells us that if we pray in his name to our loving God, we can see prayer impact powerfully in all sorts of ways. No prayer is too big for God and no prayer is too small. We can pray for ourselves, for those we love, for our city, our country and our world. A simple prayer that I sometimes pray goes something like:

"Through the power of the Spirit, in faith, truth, peace and in the powerful name of Jesus, I offer the prayers of my heart to you O God."

I offer my prayers to God and spend some time listening to what God might want to say to me.

So, I encourage you to engage with this wonderful 24/7 prayer event. This booklet is full of ways to pray and things to pray for - marvellous resources that the team has put together. I look forward to sharing stories of how prayer has been answered and am thankful for this opportunity to commit ourselves as church in Tuffley to this time of prayer together.

Thoughts on Prayer from David Crunkhurn, Elder at Grange Baptist Church

Our fellowship, which meets along Grange Road, enjoys a vibrant prayer life. Generally, Baptists don't follow specific set prayers as such, but we do enjoy sharing them on occasion with our Anglican and Catholic friends. We find comfort from Biblical scripture and the Psalms. Prayers are said without following a set pattern, but really from what is on our hearts. Prayers will contain elements of saying thank you, sorry or asking God for His provision in some form. In its simplest term, prayer is more of a conversation with God, we speak to Him in prayer and spend time listening to Him; maybe as one would talk to a friend. We encourage you to try this way of prayer too.

We pray regularly for the whole of our area of Tuffley and collectively on Sundays. During this time of difficulty, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, our building is closed. However, we continue to meet each Sunday via Facebook Live and in the evening, as a virtual gathering, where we pray together for our community of Tuffley and those in need of God's help. Any prayer requests we receive are added into these meetings and, via a prayer chain, are shared with members of the congregation, so that there is a constant stream of prayer ascending to heaven on behalf of our community.

As a Baptist Church, we are part of the West of England Baptist Network (WEBNET). This is a family of Baptist churches from across the south-west of England. Together we share in collective times of prayer and devotion via our 'Baptists Together' Website; https://baptist.org.uk This website is populated with many prayer guides and online video devotionals that are designed to inspire, comfort and guide. Resources for Meditation

Recommended by Father Gerry Walsh, Priest of English Martyrs

Lectio Divina

Lectio Divina is a dynamic way of reading the Scriptures that has been around since AD 300. Lectio Divina invites you to savour and mull over God's words quietly, slowly and intently. It gives you the space to



respond to what you feel God is saying and helps you build a vital bridge between your encounters with God and everyday life with its joys, humdrum and challenges. It follows a four-step approach of:

- a) Reading anything from the Bible prayerfully and slowly
- b) Meditation Use your imagination, ask questions, let the words be a mirror
- c) Prayer as inspired by what you have read
- d) Contemplation be still before God and invite him in.

Meditation/Contemplation:

The World Community for Christian Meditation http://www.wccm.org/ have daily reflections and an online meditation facility or an app you can download to your phone or tablet to assist you in doing mediation. They recommend for an adult 20 minutes of silent prayer, sitting in an upright posture with your eyes gently closed breathing gently, repeating one word, they suggest Maranatha, split into its 4 syllables it means Come, Lord Jesus Come.

Centre for Action and Contemplation https://cac.org/ have inspiring and challenging daily meditations which, if you wish, you can ask to be sent to you by email daily, as well as plenty of online resources.

For the Christian community:

Prayers from the Catholic Tradition:

Divine Office/Liturgy of the Hours/Mass Readings

The Divine Office is made up of psalms, canticles and readings from Scriptures and in the Office of Readings Church Fathers and Teachings of the Church as well as prayers. There are different prayers for different times of the day. It is most often prayed by religious and clergy but it is encouraged for all.

If you want to know more and to read the office go to https://universalis.com/ where you can either read a free version online or download an app which gives you an option for a paid version. You will also find the daily as well as Sunday Mass Catholic and more often than not Church of England readings for the day provided there.

Prayers for May (Month dedicated to Mary Mother of Jesus – Our Lady)

The prayer most Catholics say asking for Our Lady's intercession are the Mysteries of the Rosary of which there are now four sets. Each mystery is made up of 5 events from the lives of Jesus and Mary. Each decade starts with an Our Father, then 10 Hail Marys and ends with a Glory Be. The Hail Mary prayer starts with 2 quotes from scripture found in Luke 1 and concludes with an invocation to Jesus' mother to pray for us. The words of the Hail Mary prayer are:

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. **Holy Mary**, Mother of God, **pray** for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

O boundless love, which has given us this saving balm! O priceless balm, welling from the fount of immeasurable love! WAIT prayerfully for the Holy Spirit. Pause and breathe, creating a space into which God can speak.

READ the Bible text, allow it to enliven your heart, stir your soul and spark your imagination.

LISTEN for insight through idea or image, through recollection or curiosity. Let that Word dwell within you, as you listen for yourself and your community.

RESPOND to the prompting of the Word, with an action that leads to lifegiving change.

Let the words of the collect gather up and bless these moments of prayerful waiting upon God, so that his kingdom might be seen more fully in you.

Active Prayers for the Coronavirus Pandemic



By 24-7 Prayer

You'll need: A Bible, Worship music, Water, Soap, Tissues, Pens, Pack of plasters / band aids, Hand sanitizer

PAUSE

PRAY Psalm 46 aloud

BE STILL Breathe deeply, and welcome the Holy Spirit

REJOICE

PRAY Psalm 91 aloud

SING A song of worship about the greatness of God

ASK

PRAY FOR THE CONTAINMENT OF THE VIRUS

Using water and soap, thoroughly wash your hands. Ask God to slow and halt the spread of the Covid 19 Coronavirus. Take a moment to pray for God's particular intervention in the nations most affected.

PRAY FOR THE ILL AND ISOLATED

Using a pen and a tissue, write the names of the people you know who are self-isolating or who have contracted the virus.

Ask God to make His presence felt in solitude and to protect, strengthen and heal them.

PRAY FOR PROTECTION OF THE VULNERABLE

Take a pen and a packet of plasters / band aids. Write on plasters the names of the people you know who are elderly or have an under-lying condition that may make them susceptible to the Coronavirus. Ask God to protect them from infection.

PRAY FOR LOCAL AND NATIONAL LEADERS

Place your hands on your head and ask God to give wisdom to national and local political leaders as they make decisions to protect people. Cup your hand over your ear and ask God to bring excellent advisers to guide them. Open your hands in front of you and ask God to give them the ability to communicate clearly to the public.

PRAY FOR HEALTH PROFESSIONALS

Rub sanitiser into your hands as you ask God to protect the health professionals (doctors, nurses, ambulance crews and more) caring for those affected by the virus. Ask God to give them peace, wisdom, to anoint them for their jobs and to protect them from infection.

PRAY FOR THOSE AFFECTED IN OTHER WAYS BY THE PANDEMIC

There are many of people who will be indirectly affected by the coronavirus pandemic. Ask God to comfort those grieving the loss of loved ones, to provide for those in financial difficulty because they are unable to work, and for business leaders as they face such unprecedented disruption to life. Pray the blessing of Numbers 6:24-26 over each group.

May the Lord bless you and keep you.

May the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you.

May the Lord turn his face towards you and give you his peace.

Jehovah Shalom, Lord of Peace, we remember those living in coronavirus hotspots and those currently in isolation. May they know your presence in their isolation, your peace in their turmoil and your patience in their waiting. Prince of Peace, you are powerful and merciful; let this be their prayer -

"May your mercy come quickly to meet us, for we are in desperate need. Help us, God our Saviour, for the glory of your name."
(Psalm 79:8)



God of all Comfort and Counsel, we pray for those who are grieving, reeling from the sudden loss of loved ones. May they find your fellowship in their suffering, your comfort in their loss, and your hope in their despair. (2 Corinthians 1:10)

Jehovah Rapha, God who heals, we pray for all medical professionals dealing daily with the intense pressures of this crisis. Grant them resilience in weariness, discernment in diagnosis, and compassion upon compassion as they care. We thank you for the army of researchers working steadily and quietly towards a curegive them clarity, serendipity and unexpected breakthrough today.
