our Saviour Jesus Christ.

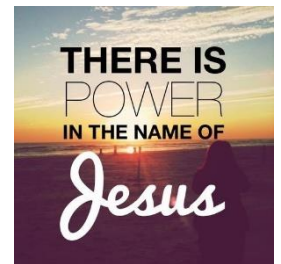

Romans 6:12-end

Free to live by God's grace

Read by Dot Martin

Therefore, do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. ¹³ No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. ¹⁴ For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.



¹⁵ What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! ¹⁶ Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷ But thanks be to God that you, having

once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, ¹⁸ and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness.

¹⁹ I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

²⁰ When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. ²¹ So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. ²² But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Prayer: Lord help us choose to live only and always by your grace which brings perfect freedom. Amen

Reflection from Helen McGeoch



How lovely it is when we plan for friends to visit. It's been a while since we've done that and it's something, we are all looking forward to again.

In our planning we would know when our friend would be coming, which friend it is, how long they will stay and what we will offer them by way of food and drink. Sometimes our planning is casual and sometimes our planning is excessive – I suppose it depends on the occasion.

But what if we didn't know who was coming?
Or maybe when they were coming?
Or even how long they would be staying?
Think about that for a moment.
Has panic set in yet?
What would our welcome look like?
How would we be prepared?
Jesus tells us we should welcome everyone as though they were Jesus himself.

Did Jesus made plans with people to visit – I imagine he just showed up. He told Zacchaeus as he was sitting in the tree that he would be going home with him for tea. That wasn't in Zacchaeus' plan. It was life-changing for him though. Jesus did a lot of things as the need arose.

Are we ready to do that? Are we ready to have our days – even our moments - interrupted by God and be prepared to give a welcome, share hospitality, kindness and love to the person God puts in front of us?

The picture in the service sheet here is of a young boy passing a snack to a person living on the street. I wonder if it was planned or whether the child just felt a nudge to do it? I wonder whether it was his snack originally or whether he purposely bought an extra one for his new friend? A nudge – that’s often how it feels when God asks us to do something. Are you looking out for your day to be interrupted by God’s nudging? Be ready to be a welcomer as Jesus asked us to be.



Heavenly Father, help us to be aware of your gentle nudges that encourage us to welcome and be kind to the people you bring to us in moments of our days. Give us generous and willing hearts that we may please you and bring honour to you. Amen.
