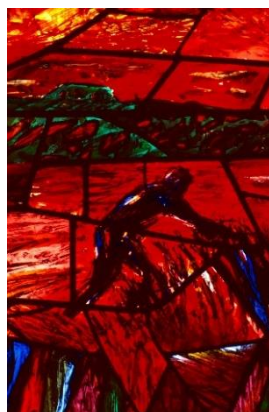

### Romans 8 Life in the Spirit

*Read by David Westcott*

<sup>12</sup> So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh— <sup>13</sup> for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup> For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. <sup>15</sup> For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba Father!' <sup>16</sup> it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, <sup>17</sup> and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.



### Future Glory

<sup>18</sup> I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. <sup>19</sup> For the creation waits with eager

longing for the revealing of the children of God; <sup>20</sup> for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope <sup>21</sup> that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. <sup>22</sup> We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labour pains until now; <sup>23</sup> and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. <sup>24</sup> For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? <sup>25</sup> But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

<sup>1</sup> O Lord, you have searched me and known me.

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bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well. <sup>27</sup> And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, "Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?" <sup>28</sup> He answered, "An enemy has done this." The slaves said to him, "Then do you want us to go and gather them?" <sup>29</sup> But he replied, "No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. <sup>30</sup> Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn."

### Jesus Explains the Parable of the Weeds

<sup>36</sup> Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, 'Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field.' <sup>37</sup> He answered, 'The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; <sup>38</sup> the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, <sup>39</sup> and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. <sup>40</sup> Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. <sup>41</sup> The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, <sup>42</sup> and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. <sup>43</sup> Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!

### Reflection from Pete Best

When we read the parable of the 'weeds among the wheat', then view wheat fields on TV, there is rarely a weed in sight. That's just as well. How would we feel about finding a bundle of 'rag wort' in our breakfast cereal? Today's parable is clear God is GOOD. Satan is BAD.

Years ago, I used to awake to my radio alarm. At 7am Radio 4 would broadcast the headlines. As I listened, one bad news item after another wafted over the airwaves. I thought, 'I don't need this', and immediately switched off the radio and unset the alarm. Who needs bad news?

Satan is behind much of today's bad news. Having been evicted from heaven (Luke 10:18) Satan knows he can't overcome God, so he seeks to destroy those who worship Him. He uses deception to steal our joy, our health, our family, anything we value. He will do all he



can to get us to doubt God.

If you've been burgled, scammed, or ripped off, how did you feel? It's Satan's way to get us to sometimes question God, "Why me?"

The good news is God is not prepared for Satan to snatch away any of His children. The Psalm shows it doesn't matter what we are doing, thinking, or saying, His Spirit is within us. He looks to guide us to the people He wants us to serve.

We might suffer knock backs, as we go out of our homes into our 'wheat field' of Tuffley and Podsmead, but does it matter?

If we are rejected by someone, consider this, it is Jesus they are rejecting, not us. By serving the Lord together we can look beyond the knock backs of the weeds, so we too can 'shine like the sun in the kingdom of our Father' (Matt 13:43). Amen

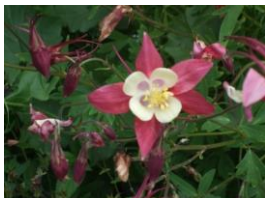
