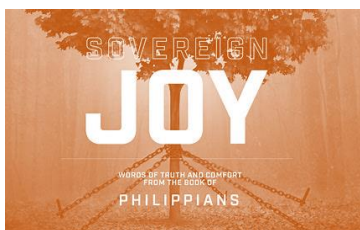

Was the mighty Word:



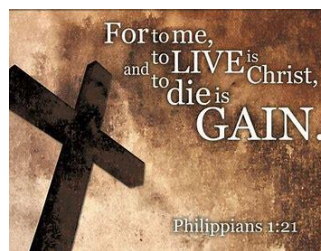
Humbled for a season,

²¹ For to me, living is Christ and dying is gain. ²² If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labour for me; and I do not know which I prefer. ²³ I am hard pressed between the two: my desire is to depart and

be with Christ, for that is far better; ²⁴ but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for you. ²⁵ Since I am convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in faith, ²⁶ so that I may share abundantly in your boasting in Christ Jesus when I come to you again.

²⁷ Only, live your life in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that, whether I come and see you or am absent and hear about you, I will know that you are standing firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel, ²⁸ and are in no way intimidated by your opponents. For them this is evidence of their destruction, but of your salvation. And

this is God's doing.²⁹ For he has graciously granted you the privilege not only of believing in Christ, but of suffering for him as well—³⁰ since you are having the same struggle that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

⁴⁵ That they might keep his statutes **and faithfully observe his laws. Alleluia.**

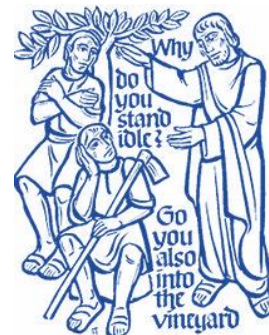

Matthew 20 The Labourers in the Vineyard

¹ For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. ² After agreeing with the labourers for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. ³ When

he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the market-place;⁴ and he said to them, "You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right." So they went. ⁵ When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. ⁶ And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, "Why are you standing here idle all day?" ⁷ They said to him, "Because no one has hired us." He said to them, "You also go into the vineyard." ⁸ When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, "Call the labourers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first." ⁹ When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage. ¹⁰ Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual daily wage. ¹¹ And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, ¹² saying, "These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat." ¹³ But he replied to one of them, "Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? ¹⁴ Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. ¹⁵ Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?" ¹⁶ So the last will be first, and the first will be last.'

Reflection from Canon Mike Parsons

There's No Damned Merit In It

This was the title of a piece some years ago in *The Times* by the late Enoch Powell, MP, later notorious for his 'Rivers of Blood' speech, and was thought based round this week's gospel reading, the labourers in the vineyard. It is certainly a shocking parable and would cause uproar if a modern day employer decided to pay every worker exactly the same despite how many hours they worked. It is even more potent in Jesus' original context as it would be evident to the hearers that the only reason most of the later employed workers were employed late in the day is because they were too lazy to seek work. In fact, particularly the last ones hired were probably hanging around in the market place because they had no intention of working but hanging out— and probably having a drink - with other idle men. The Vineyard in the scriptures is almost always God's vineyard and the harvest of it is the Kingdom of God and Jesus is pointing out that his Father is looking for workers in his vineyard to bring in his harvest. There is

only one 'reward' on offer for this work: life in the Kingdom. No matter how long we have been Christians, no matter how much time, money and sacrifice we have given to the church and the gospel – there is still only one reward. The penitent thief gets everything he never thought he really wanted all at the last minute.

This weekend we are ordaining 13 deacons and 9 priests in the Cathedral (with all sorts of Covid friendly processes). They are already labourers in the vineyard – what about you? You don't need to be ordained to work in the Father's vineyard, but there will be no dammed merit in it. Just as well for most of us!

We affirm: Jesus is Lord of our lives.

who enables us to live
