

Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful in my ministry ¹² I have sent Tychicus to Ephesus. ¹³ When you come, bring the cloak that I left with Carpus at Troas, also the books, and above all the parchments. ¹⁴ Alexander the coppersmith did me great harm; the Lord will pay him back for his deeds. ¹⁵ You also must beware of him, for he strongly opposed our message. ¹⁶ At my first defence no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them!

¹ After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. ² He said to them,



'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. ³ Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. ⁴

Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. ⁵ Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace to this house!" ⁶ And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you.

⁷ Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Reflection from Pete Best

The Confirmation Service today, led by Bishop Robert, is important, not only for the three ladies who are being Confirmed, but it is also important for the whole body of Christ. Confirmation marks a decision to live a responsible and committed Christian life.

Both the New Testament and Gospel readings today 'Confirm' the commitment of the early church to the spreading of the 'Good News' of Jesus Christ.

Initially Jesus commissioned and sent out His twelve disciples, giving them power to cast out unclean spirits and heal all manner of sickness and disease. Now however Jesus is aware of the need to escalate His ministry. What He said to the seventy, He says to us all, "Pray to the Lord of the harvest that He would send labourers into His harvest".

That is a challenge to us all. It may seem daunting to share your testimony with a family member, a friend or a complete stranger, but throughout His ministry Jesus continually gave confirmation of who His Father was.

Jesus gave 'Confirmation' to His disciples, and to us, of the awesomeness and holiness of His Father by teaching His disciples 'The Lord's prayer'.



He gave 'Confirmation' to the nation of Israel, and to us, that the law of Moses and what they had come to know as the 'Ten Commandments' was fully covered by His command to 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength and mind; and to love your neighbour as yourself'.

Jesus gave 'Confirmation' to everyone who followed Him, as He does to us, by teaching the eight blessings in what we call the 'Beatitudes'. These spell out for us, what it means to live as a child of God's kingdom.

Over time His disciples gave 'Confirmation' of their faith in God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit, in the words of the 'Apostles Creed'; a statement of faith which we embrace each Sunday.

Child of God, don't keep the faith, proclaim it.

We declare together our commitment to faith:

**We believe in God the Father,
from whom every family
in heaven and on earth is named.
We believe in God the Son,
who lives in our hearts through faith,
and fills us with his love.
We believe in God the Holy Spirit,
who strengthens us
with power from on high.
We believe in one God;
Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.**

Carols by Candlelight at St Margaret's...

We are hoping to be able to stage Carols by Candlelight this year. However, before we start planning we need to know if you are interested to attend. The thought is we stage the event on up to 4 evenings during Advent.

We will have to conform to Covid regulations so:

We believe we shall be able to accommodate 25-30 people each evening.

You would need to book, telling us how many people in your party and give your preferred date plus 2 alternatives in case your preferred date is fully booked. On the evening you attend you would be shown to your allocated pew.

The service would last about 25 minutes.

Sadly, there will be no singing from the congregation.

But, on the positive side:

The church will be atmospherically lit by dozens of candles. The church will be heated.

We need to know as soon as possible if you are happy to come. Before you leave church let a Warden know you are interested.
