Reflection from Canon Andrew Braddock

Imagine a toddler taking their first solo steps. They have held on to the adult's hand, gaining confidence in walking. Now is the moment to let go and step out on their own. There will be bumps, bruises and maybe even tears, but there will also be new freedom.

Those first solo steps are mothering in miniature. The love and security of the held hand are what gives the toddler confidence to let go and walk solo. The loving is in the letting go and in the being there to pick the toddler up when things go wrong.

This year we've been discovering afresh what it means to love, to let go and to be there for others.

Not being able to hug or to hold another's hand in reassurance, have been painful losses. At the same time different forms of social media, phone calls, writing letters and sending gifts, have assumed fresh importance. Separated physically, we've discovered new ways to be together and to encourage each other in difficult days.

On Mothering Sunday, these themes assume fresh importance and stir mixed emotions.

It's a time for reflection as we recall all those who have 'mothered' us over the years. Their love has given us the confidence to step out and become the people God calls us to be.

Such love will hurt. Today's Gospel points towards Mary letting Jesus go as he walks the way of the cross: 'a sword will pierce your own soul too'.

Yet without love, what is life? Paul writes '...clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together...'

Paul is encouraging us to wrap ourselves in God's embrace, for God is love.

As good mothering holds us secure, giving us the confidence to take our own steps in life, so God's love is the anchor point that gives us the freedom to risk loving others and to love ourselves.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made: of one being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven was Incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again, in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory, to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord the giver of life who proceeds from the Father and the Son who with the Father and the son is worshipped and glorified who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen

Hear us, merciful Father, we humbly pray, and grant that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, we receiving these gifts of your creation, this bread and this wine, according to your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed body and blood; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying; Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Jesus Christ is Lord: **Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free, You are the saviour of the world.** Therefore, Lord and heavenly Father, in remembrance of the precious death and passion, the mighty resurrection and glorious ascension of your dear Son Jesus Christ, we offer you through him this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving.

Grant that by his merits and death, and through faith in his blood, we and all your Church may receive forgiveness of our sins and all other benefits of his passion. Although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer you any sacrifice, yet we pray that you will accept this the duty and service that we owe. Do not weigh our merits, but pardon our offences, and fill us all who share in this holy communion with your grace and heavenly blessing; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father for ever and ever. **Amen.**
