What a month!

What a month we have ahead, with Holy Week, Easter, and St George's Day. Further through Crossroads you will find details of services and activities during Holy Week, including a day spent together as the Church in Tuffley on Good Friday. It will be very special to be together that day, and do please come along to any of the elements that day as you can: 10.00am until12.00noon Messy Easter at St Barnabas, 1.00pm Holy Communion at Grange Baptist, 1.30pm walk of witness round Tuffley setting off from Grange Baptist, 3.00pm Mass at English Martyrs (only Roman Catholics will be able to receive Communion at this service, but everyone is very welcome be present). You will also find details of St George's and St Margaret's Easter services further through Crossroads, and we very much look forward to celebrating this most joyful time together.

I particularly want to highlight our St George's Day celebrations this year. We have anniversaries to celebrate! Last year it was 50 years since the consecration of St George's Church and Centre, which took place on 21 September 1971. In addition, it is 80 years now since the whole site was acquired and dedicated for a church building. In 1942 the wooden hut Mission Hall was moved from Whaddon to act as a new temporary church building – as shown in the photo below.



The first temporary church at St Georges, 1942. This was previously the Whaddon Mission Hall, moved from near Whaddon School on the Stroud Road.

On St George's Day (23 April) this year, we are planning a community celebration day to mark these anniversaries as well as the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We will be displaying many more photos like the one above, along with a potted history of St George's and Tuffley. If you have any photos from over the years, or any memories to share, do please let us know before St George's Day.

St George's will be open on the afternoon of Saturday 23 April, for you to see these photos and memories, refreshments will be served, and there will be outdoor games and activities for children and adults alike to enjoy. In the later afternoon/early evening, there will be a BBQ and music for all to enjoy (in the Centre if the weather is bad!) On Sunday 24 April there will be a 10.30am celebration service followed be celebratory cake and fizz (tea and coffee will also be available!)

Please do put this weekend in your diary and come along on the 23/24 April as you are able. It will be fantastic to be able to celebrate together as a community of Tuffley, and to give thanks for the past 80 years of St George's!

I wish you every blessing for Holy Week and Easter, and look forward to hearing your memories and stories for St George's Day,

A POSTSCRIPT FROM THE FLAG LOCKER

I didn't expect to be giving you yet more news from the flag locker quite so soon, but we have two new flags to tell you about.

The first is for a deplorable reason, namely the atrocities being committed against the people of Ukraine. We are now flying a large blue and yellow Ukraine flag at Saint Margarets. At nine feet long it is actually 26% larger in area than our usual eight by four. It certainly leaves no one in any doubt as to its message.



The second is an entirely new flag, unique to Saint Margaret's. I'm calling it the Whaddon Royal Standard. It comprises the St Edward's cross in the top left and bottom right quarters. This is the flag we normally fly for our patron Saint Margaret of Scotland, who was niece of King Edward the Confessor. Top right is the Red Lion of Scotland, and bottom left the three leopards (or lions) of England. Put that lot together on one flag and you have something very reminiscent of the official Royal Standard - which can only be flown when the sovereign is present.

This lovely new flag will be used on future royal flag days. It was kindly sponsored by Roger Western in memory of his late wife Ann, who for many years was a devoted churchwarden and PCC secretary at Saint Margaret's.

You will get your own 'nectar score' which will tell you how many bees your lawn can feed, and you will help Plantlife learn more about the health of the nation's wildflowers.

Emily from Primrose Hill Primary Academy said, "When we did No Mow May last year, we found a rare pink grasshopper in the lawn. Their bright colour means that they are easily spotted by predators and do not survive for long. The long grass must have been helping it to hide."
