Easter services

The main Easter services at St Margaret's will be an Easter Vigil on the Saturday evening at 8.30pm, and communion at 9.00am on Easter Day, followed by Family Praise at 10.30. (No evensong, even though it's a third Sunday.)

'Easter Vigil' may give the impression that it's a gloomy service, with a lot of sitting in silence. Definitely not! It's an exciting Eucharist which starts in semi-darkness with the first fire of Easter and works up gradually to a blaze of light and lots of music. The best way to start our Easter celebrations.




When we last produced a newsletter, we little thought that we would soon be flying a Ukrainian national flag, still less the grim reasons for it. It's actually a nine foot flag - a touch too big for the pole - but it sends out the clearest message. We hope it may give some comfort especially to members of the Ukrainian community here in Gloucester.

On a happier note, we have acquired a Welsh Dragon flag for St David's day, and we are currently awaiting delivery of a totally new and unique flag, which we are calling the Whaddon Royal Standard. It's a combination of the St Edward's cross (for St Margaret of Scotland), the Scottish Lion, and the Three Leopards (or lions) of England. Any resemblance to the official Royal Standard is highly intentional, and we will look forward to flying it on royal occasions especially during this jubilee year.

This flag was very kindly sponsored by Roger Western in memory of his dear wife Ann, who for so many years was a staunch supporter of St Margaret's, and who served as churchwarden and PCC secretary.
