# **LIFE Together**

LIFE has been the Gloucester Diocese vision and strapline since 2017, and this has now transitioned to LIFE Together. LIFE is based on the promise we have from Jesus, as recorded in the Bible in John 10.10: "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full" or in some versions, "have it abundantly". We have been encouraged and challenged to think about what life in all its fullness and abundance looks like, and to celebrate and give thanks for this life. LIFE Together suggests that this fullness of life is truly appreciated and realised together.

I would say, over the Jubilee weekend, we really saw the fullness of LIFE together. Our Church in Tuffley picnic had such a joyful atmosphere and it was great to be together across the five churches in Tuffley and Whaddon – thank you very much to all who came along. Locally and nationally, there were many street parties, community and family activities over the weekend too that saw people coming together in ways that haven't been possible for over two years now. Together we all had something to celebrate and give thanks for; Queen Elizabeth II's 70 years of dedicated and faithful service.

As Christians, of course, we have something to celebrate and give thanks for always; that through our baptism, we die and are raised to new life through Jesus. That new life is one that is full of hope and love and leads to eternal life – it is indeed a fullness and abundance of LIFE. The question for us is, how do we live this LIFE together at St George's and St Margaret's that reflects the fullness and abundance of life with Jesus.

When I talk in assemblies about working together, helping each other, and the importance of teamwork, I often use the Lego song, 'everything is better when we stick together' – it's a catchy song (google it if you'd like it in your head!) with a profound message. Trying to do anything alone, in our own strength, is futile – we are called to live LIFE together in the power and strength of Jesus.

LIFE together doesn't mean that everyone has to do everything, more that people will feel able to be themselves and to contribute in their own way. We see this across our benefice, with many people using their time and their talents

to benefit our whole LIFE together. The pandemic has knocked many and there are still anxieties and hesitation about, but please know that however you are part of our community, you are an important part, and that we strive onwards to LIFE together in the power and strength of Jesus.

# ARCHDEACONS' VISITATION GLOU and ADMISSION OF CHURCHWARDENS SERVICE

We were delighted at St George's to be asked to host one of the four Archdeacons' Visitation services this year. What is a Visitation service I hear some ask... well, it's the service where churchwardens are thanked for their service and admitted by the Diocesan Registrar for the coming year. The service is always led by an archdeacon, and this year by two archdeacons! This is because previously Gloucester Diocese have held one service per deanery, led by the relevant archdeacon. However, this year, the two archdeacons, Hilary and Phil, have teamed up to do just four services across the diocese, and to do them together.



The first of these services was held at St George's on Thursday 9th June and was attended by 210 people! There are photos of a packed car park, people queuing to get into church, and a full to bursting church! It was so good to hear the resounding singing in the church, and huge thanks to our organist Jonathan. The service

was very uplifting and encouraging thanks to the archdeacons informal and engaging style, and it was a privilege to host such an important service.

The Visitation service is such an important one, because the churchwarden role and calling is fundamental to the life of our church communities. The words said by the Diocesan Registrar at the Visitation service highlight the importance of the role:

The Church is the Body of Christ, and through baptism every member is called to ministry and to service. You are called to special responsibilities. With your clergy, you are to share in the administration of the parish and the care of the church buildings. You are to promote the whole mission of the Church, which is pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. These things you are called to do to the glory of God and for the well-being of Christ's Church.

We must extend a sincere thank you to our churchwardens, for the years they

have already served in the role, and for being willing to serve for another year: Mike Brammer, Sylvia Evans, Jonathan MacKechnie-Jarvis and Hans Rackham. We are very fortunate in our benefice to have four dedicated and faithful churchwardens who give so generously of their time and talents.

#### REVEREND RACHEL BECK'S INDUCTION CELEBRATION


