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#### **REV RACHEL WRITES...**

#### Tell the story of God's love

September is often thought of as a time of new beginnings. Children and young people go back to school, sometimes to new schools, colleges and universities. It can feel like a time for fresh starts, full of potential. Of course, as Christians, we believe every day to be like this. Through Christ, we have a new beginning at our baptism and every day brings a fresh start as we have the opportunity every day to choose afresh to live our lives walking with God. As we do this it can be helpful to remind ourselves of our calling and purpose as Christians.

At the end of June, some of us were able to be present at the ordination service at Gloucester Cathedral, to witness Helen McGeough be ordained priest. It was a joyful service, where we were all encouraged to reflect on our calling as Christians. I spent some time afterwards praying with the words of that service and was struck afresh by the words 'with all God's people, you are to tell the story of God's love'. What an amazing way of summing up what we are called to as Christians – individually and collectively as a Christian community. Through the way we live our lives and interact with one another, are we telling the story of God's love?

Looking back over our benefice life this Summer, I can see many examples of us doing this collectively. The teddy bear picnic and zip-wire at St Margaret's was such a fantastic afternoon, full of joy, love and laughter. So many families came from our local community, and we were able to spend relaxed, fun time with them in the beautiful surroundings of the churchyard (and weren't we blessed with the weather?!) Thank you so much to those who made it possible, and to those who spread the word and invited people, and to those who prayed for the event – God really blessed our time together. Fun and Free Tuesdays at St George's have been another way we've been telling the story of God's love – through the joy of playing games together, chatting, and sharing ice lollies! This was extended in August to a longer time, and families enjoyed arts and crafts, a wider range of games, and the joy of being together; one parent commented, 'it's just so good to have somewhere to come and be together'.

There are, of course, many more examples of how you tell the story of God's love in quiet, everyday ways, often that are known only to you and God, or to

a few people – and for this we give thanks and praise too. Why not spend some time this month reflecting on the new beginning of every day, the fresh potential every morning, and how you live your life walking with God, telling the story of God's love?

## THE WHADDON TBP



Isn't it great that we can now own up to owning our teddies? Years ago, adults tended to keep them under wraps, or pretend that they belonged to their children. These days, many of us have "come out" and now talk openly about our teds ... and I think that the St Margaret's teddy bears picnic (or TBP) was as much for grown-ups as for children.

Our TBP was a fun day, midweek, designed to appeal to young families and to introduce them to our church and churchyard. The main attraction was the zip wire from the flagpole down to ground level, a drop of 57 feet at about 1 in 3. Derek Kingscote and I looked after the practical arrangements, with help from Stuart Mitchell. We had a successful dry run a week or so in advance.

The PR machine was very successful, so much so that we were kept very busy indeed. Eighty certificates were run off for presentation to the teddy owners, and these were soon used up. I'd say that at least 200 descents were made, probably more: some teds did have as many as five rides!



The arrival crew comprised Rachel and her mother, who

between them had to release the teds from the line, get their harnesses off, issue the certificate and note the name and type of the passenger. To make life harder for them, the teds came down in waves, rather than a steady stream, this being dependent on the basket hauled up the side of the tower from the departure area, which was looked after by Lorraine.



The teds were by no means all bears. There were monkeys, a cow, a turtle, a group of three blue dragons that we could only call heffalumps, a baby doll, a tiger, a banana man, various pandas and many more besides, in all shapes and colours. It was quite fun because I was given a radio mike to describe them as they set off, the idea being that people did not miss the great moment for their particular ted. In addition to all this, we had a "Stick the Nose on the Ted" sideshow, and various other games to play.

It was all a bit hectic, but one thing was obvious everyone enjoyed themselves, and tucked into their picnics under bright sunshine. There were many new faces, including some from the new houses at Yew Tree Gardens.



Huge thanks to all who helped. The clearing up went surprisingly quickly with many hands. Will we do it

again? My vote would be yes, but not for a little while. We need to keep thinking up new ideas for both churches.

# A FRESH START FOR FAMILY PRAISE

As you may have heard, Family Praise at St Margaret's will be a bit different from this autumn. After nearly thirty years at 10.30am on the first Sunday, we are changing to an afternoon slot: 4.00pm on the second Sunday.

What's all this about? Well, for a long time we have known that families often have other commitments on a Sunday morning - football or swimming for the children, and so on. Afternoon does seem to be a better time... but the proof of the pudding will be in the eating.

Another advantage of an afternoon slot is that Rachel will be able to be there, whereas in the past it has been very rare for our parish priest to take part, due of course to the 10.30am service at St George's.

#### **OLD STYLE POSTAGE STAMPS**

Royal Mail is shaking up the rules on stamps, so if you've got a stash that currently say 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> class on them then by 31 January 2023, you'll no longer be able to simply stick'em on a letter and use them. This is because Royal Mail is moving to a new barcode system, which these stamps don't have.

You've now got less than six months to use any non-barcoded everyday stamps – those with the Queen's profile on – before they become worthless on 31 January 2023.

Refreshments available on both days, with toilet facilities on site.


Information sheets will be available, and the event will be stewarded.




# **FILM GROUP - THE MYSTERY OF EVERYTHING**

As paper notes are returned to the Bank of England, they are being replaced

with the new polymer £20 notes featuring JMW Turner, and polymer £50 notes featuring Alan Turing.

After 30 September, only our polymer notes will have legal tender status.


