I Peter 3 Suffering for doing right

¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹ in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰ who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. ²¹ And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²² who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

Prayer: Lord thank You for rescuing us through baptism into Your resurrection. Amen

Psalm 25 A plea for deliverance and forgiveness

1 To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul; **O my God, in you I trust; let me not be put to shame; let not my enemies triumph over me.**

Reflection from Rev Canon Dr Sandra Millar

We are at the beginning of Lent, and the lectionary takes us to the beginning of Jesus' ministry, a beginning marked by baptism.

There is much written about Jesus' baptism – but one thing stands out for me. It is the day when Jesus knows that God looks on him with love and claims him as his own. That knowledge is the gift given to each of us in our baptism, however long ago it happened, when our journey of faith began, and we were assured that God's love will accompany us through every changing scene of life. Over the years we learn that our relationship with God is strong enough and big enough to take us through all that life brings – the good times, the sad times, the hard times. Baptism is about God's grace in forgiving, and God's love always welcoming us home, however far we drift off the path, as long as we turn back. This is a great place to begin our journey through Lent once more.

In Lent we make choices to be more disciplined – or more disciplined. We choose to follow the journey of Jesus, and to live out the reality of our baptism as we rediscover all those promises, prayers and choices that were made. We make commitments to new actions, which sometimes involve saying no, and sometimes yes. We can choose each day not to be disappointed or downhearted but to be joyful,





hopeful people – to be glad and thankful for all that has brought us safely to this day, and all that will lead us to tomorrow. Above all, we can remember love – the love we know through others, and the great love of God holding us. Then we can step out once more to follow, knowing that when we fail, as we surely will, there will be forgiveness and a new start. May this Lent be a time of hope for you.

We declare together our commitment to faith with the words of the Creed:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made; of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again, in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory, to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life who proceeds from the Father and the Son who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Eternal Lord, we bring to you all those who will be making decisions for our country in the coming week. Give them your wisdom and your compassion, that what is decided will be for the good of all and not just the few, and where there are conflicting requests, may they hear not just those who shout loudest, but those whose voices are quiet.

Be with us when we confront the dark places, go before us as we step out in faith and give us courage when the road before us appears hard and uphill. Above all, remind us that your love surrounds us at every step we take.

Loving Lord, we pray for those we know who are ill at this time, and ask that, when we are unable to put our arms around them, they will still sense yours are there. And as we mourn those who have gone before us, remind us that one day we will be with them, worshipping you before your eternal throne. Amen.

Although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer you any sacrifice, yet we pray that you will accept this the duty and service that we owe. Do not weigh our merits, but pardon our offences, and fill us all who share in this holy communion with your grace and heavenly blessing; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father for ever and ever. **Amen.**
